LOVE: A good working definition for love is "seeking the highest welfare for the one who is loved." Love is the motivation for planting and cultivating the 12 Seeds. It's also the bonding agent, the glue that holds good relationships together. The last verse in Colossians 3:12-14 says, "And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity." The word love is used 551 times in the Bible – it's that important.

12 Seeds Summer Update: We're thankful for all that God has been doing with the 12 Seeds in 2018. Here's a brief summary of what's been happening:

- Presented weekly on-site 12 Seeds devotional sessions for residents at New Hope Men's Recovery Center in south Minneapolis.
- Taught monthly on-site *12 Seeds* classes at Forgiven & Set Free in Duluth.
- Spoke on three different occasions at FreedomWorks Connection Dinners in north Minneapolis.
- Attended Prison Transition Fairs at Shakopee Women's and St. Cloud prisons with plans to visit Stillwater prison in October.
- Provided 12 Seeds discussion exercises to Timber Bay, a youth ministry in Buffalo, MN.
- Organized the Free Training Tool section of our website to make training tools easier to locate.



Forgiven & Set Free: On Tuesday, July 10th, Norm spoke at the Forgiven & Set Free recovery group that meets at Gospel Tabernacle in Duluth. He continued teaching in the 12 Seeds Gifts of Love series. They reviewed the first few pages of the series, then focused on how sharing the principles of the 12 Seeds are ways to love others. Each seed helps fill a human need. We discussed the "transformation toward greater Christlikeness" which is covered in the series: growing from a "take & take" style of living to "receive & share" living. We looked at James 1:17, which states that "every good and perfect gift" comes from God. We are to receive those gifts and then share them with others.
